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Hello everyone and welcome to the Nick Vujicic Ministries, Life Without Limbs monthly livestream. As you know, I refused to wear hand sanitizer. And so COVID kind of made us go, "Well, wait a second. We should just go online every single month."

So thank you so much for praying for us tonight before we start, I'm going to be praying for you before I talk about tonight's topic. First of all, we've titled it, "Filtered." And the subtitle is "Living with Unfiltered Faith."

My name is Nick. If you've never joined me here, we do this monthly livestreaming. And if you know somebody who needs a little bit of encouragement, and almost any an enlightning to faith walk with Jesus and make Him the hope that they can hold onto, please make sure that you don't just come and watch yourself and be encouraged. Think about others in your life, who might need that same encouragement.

Everyone, let's bow our heads and hearts before the Lord.

"Lord Jesus, we can be fine. We thank You that You are indeed the King of kings and Lord of lords. And we ask, God, to bless those who are watching from all around the world right now. We thank You for technology that allows us to do this. And may You prepare our hearts and our minds for what You have for us tonight. In Jesus name we pray, Amen."

Awesome. Just remember that at the end of this message, we're going to have a live Q&A session. So, make sure that you stick around until the very end. And you can submit your questions in the chat box. And before I get into the preface of tonight, I just want to say thank you to the Hope Center based here in Dallas, Texas, our new headquarter home for the Ministry of Life Without Limbs.

As of May 1, we're making this move. And the end of that transition of the move is June. I want to say thank you to June Hunt and her team at Home for the Heart Ministries for having us there in the Hope Center. We love you all very, very much. And thank you, Colonel Allen West for your welcome and the team.

Guys, tonight, there are many times in my life where I've been thinking about what we're about to chat about. But even for me, you know, when we look at ourselves in the mirror, and we look at the world, and the world around us, like in people and then you watch on TV, like you see all these pictures on television of these pretty people, and I went to school and I'm like,

"Man, I wish I looked like them!" And man, as I grew up as a teenager I'm looking at, you know, the magazines, and then we've all got social media, you know, filters and distorting the reality so that what we see isn't real.

And the first time I realized like that stuff on TV ain't real and perfect people with perfect lives don't really exist, like it was a shock to me. But you know, like the edited photos and videos they don't tell the whole story, or the truth whatsoever sometimes. And I believe like no other generation in history, we are a generation that compares ourselves to the filtered lives of others.

And that's so unhealthy. I mean, it doesn't matter how old you are. It doesn't matter where you are in this world, like peer pressure to even live a life that is filtered in our own mind because of what we see in others and what we think is good and what we think is better. We change those

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things that we kind of display in our own lives as perfect. And we do as much as we can to hide our own imperfections. Do you have things about yourself that you don't like or things that you've done that you regret? Are there things in your life that maybe you prefer to be filtered from the public view altogether?

What I love about when I met Jesus and when we all meet Jesus is Jesus meets us where we're at. And there are times in life where it's the image. It's me trying to prepare myself, you know, to get ready for Jesus to get ready to a point where I feel like, "Okay, I think I'm now ready to ask God into my life or take over my life now that I've experienced this experience that. Whatever ideologies we had that prevented us from saying yes to Jesus, it's that kind of filtration that we put on ourselves.

It's very unhealthy and very sad. But then also as a Christian, when you go out, we sometimes are faced with challenges, where whether we're at work or on the television. I, as a public figure, I've had my own filtering kind of experiences.

One of the people that I've always wanted to meet since 2002, was Oprah Winfrey. And several years ago, I was invited by Pastor Rick Warren, to go on the show with him on a "Lifeclass" that talked about the cards that we had dealt with in life, our circumstances, our personality, our chemistry, and all these kinds of things.

And I said, "Absolutely, I'd love to be on there." And they were livestreaming it. But then they were able to, you know, edit it afterward, and then take out the pieces that they didn't feel was necessary to keep in. What I didn't know, though, at the time was that they were going to do so much editing.

And what they didn't know is before the show started, I was, you know, told by God not to actually listen to the advice I was given by the production crew. The production crew came up to me and said, "Now, Nick, this is your seat, and you're supposed to stay here. And we've given you a script, and you can't talk about Jesus, you can't talk about your book, you can't talk about faith, we need you to focus in on students and, and bullying and kind of like motivational."

Well, what they do know was, God's like, "Nah, nah, nah. This is my moment, for you to shine, My Son's light and truth without any filter.

And what was amazing was I'm like, "Hey, God, how do you want me to do this?" And I just had this urge to get up on stage where I'm like, I've been told I need to sit in my seat. I'm not allowed to go on stage, like, they're gonna just pick me up and back down, right? I'm gonna get like, tackled or handcuffed or something, I don't know.

And I saw this staircase. And I'm like, "Oh, my goodness is five cards that Rick Warren's talking about? If and I saw a stake," so I'm like, "Hey, God, I'm going to put a fleece out there. If, if it's five jumps from the floor to the top of the stage, if it's five jumps, five cards, then I'll take that as a sign that you want me to go up on stage."

And guess what? I counted 1-2-3-4-5. And I'm like, "Okay," so it was all--how do you say improvisation. My caregiver Udi next to me, I'm like, "Udi, make sure my microphone, don't you know, make sure it's tucked in really nice. And make sure it's tight because I'm doing something crazy."

He said, "What are you doing?"

"I'll tell more. Just watch."

I was so nervous. And it was one of the most humbling moments for me to know that they asked me to be filtered. But God asked me not to be filtered, to go and be bold and have confidence. And what was amazing was, as I had, by the grace of God, the courage and boldness to be willing to show my real self and talk about my God with no filter, I actually got out, jumped up eight steps, talked about each of the five cards that were dealt with. And because that sequence was Nick getting out of the chair going up on the stairs, and then on stage, they couldn't filter out a single second.

Guess what they did with Rick Warren? They cut out every "J" word. You know that swear word, "Jesus." Now look, I love Oprah. I do. I love I pray for her actually. Because she needs to use that pulpit to say Jesus is Lord no matter what. Done. Finished.

And I'm praying for and I'm praying for many other celebrities and other social media influences. But I just want to share with you that when God calls you to do something, don't hold back.

Don't try and wait or don't try and listen to somebody else. When you know you need God, God's not waiting for you to kind of get better, or present yourself with filters. He says, "Come as you are." Why? He really knows everything. He already knows the truth. He already knows what you've done. And despite ourselves, He still loves us.

And He says, "Just come to Me." You know, I'm reminded of a story in the Bible about a woman who came to Jesus just the way that she was—no filters. The Bible calls her an immoral woman, a sinful woman. We don't know what she did that would, you know, made her immoral. The Bible doesn't mention that. But somehow that had become her reputation. But despite her sin, her shame, and her regret, she came to Jesus—ready? Unfiltered.

Luke 7:36, "One of the Pharisees asked Jesus to have dinner with him. So, Jesus went to his home and sat down to eat.

Verse 37 - "When a certain immoral woman from that city heard He was eating there, she brought a beautiful alabaster jar, filled with expensive perfume."

Verse 38 - "She knelt behind him at His feet, weeping. Her tears fell on His feet, and she wiped them off with her hair. Then she kept kissing His feet and putting perfume on them." Verse 39 - "When the Pharisee who had invited Him saw this, he said to himself, 'If this man were a prophet, He would know what kind of woman is touching Him. She's a sinner.' And Jesus said to the woman, 'Your faith has saved you. Go in peace."

How awesome is that? God wants you to come to Him just as you. You know, so many people say, "Well, once I get my life together, then I'll come and be ready. Once I start, you know, doing this, or once I stop saying the "F" word, or once...."

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Look, even the best carpenter can't fix your broken home until you let the carpenter in the house to fix. It's like saying, "Well, I need to get ready before He comes to us," like, "I'll go to the gym once I'm in shape." I mean, who does that?

No one does that. If you first come to Jesus, He will help you put your life back together. He will take your broken pieces in His hands, and sometimes we will say, "Oh, God, You're taking too long, God, I don't know the blueprint of Your plan for my life."

But if you trust Him, and you let Him into your life, and you converse with Him, a personal relationship with Him, where He is your Lord and Savior, you have that humbling heart moment when you say, "God, I don't want my plan anymore. I don't want my strength anymore. My plan and my strength, they fail me—my intellect"—whatever it is.

You know, maybe you realize with 2020 behind us that you've put some hope and trust in things that you shouldn't be, and we must put out hope on Jesus Himself. He will help you overcome life's challenges. He will forgive you of your sin, and help you start a new journey with Him.

This is where faith comes in. FAITH: Faith: Full Assurance In The Heart. Jesus told the immoral woman, "Your faith has saved you."

You see, it takes faith to come to Jesus without any filters, to come to Jesus just as you are. It takes faith to believe that God is who He says He is: The Creator of all that we see and all that we don't see, God the Father, God the Son, God the Holy Spirit, the Son of God, who died in the cross for our sins, three days, on the third day rose again, and the Savior of the world.

It takes faith to believe that God is good when things around you might not seem so good. And He wants the very best for you. Hebrews 11:6 says, "And it is impossible to please God without faith. Anyone who wants to come to Him must believe that God exists, and that He rewards those who sincerely seek Him."

In other words, I want you to know that you can see faith as trust. I want to encourage you to today to trust God. What on earth could God at all ever reward you with? For talking about giving the limbless man arms and legs? He's not talking about giving a growth spurt to Zacchaeus.

He's not giving a barren woman a reward for trusting Him a child. Can He do all these things? Sure.

But the greatest miracle of all, my friend, is not a physical miracle. You are created in such a way that you have a soul, spirit, mind, and body; and the body is last. He rewards you with what you most need. Who better to tell you what you most need than the One who created you, the purpose that He's designed you to have?

He is going to say to you tonight, "Seek Me and you will find me when you search for me with all your heart. I will be found by you declares the Lord." That's Jeremiah 29:13-14 to trust in His existence, to trust that He is good, to trust that He has the best in mind for you. That might seem a little impossible for you right now. But I want you to know that if God can use a man without arms and legs to be His hands and feet and become a general in the army of God to stand in front of the gates of hell and redirect traffic, then God can use any willing heart.

And if there's any area of your life that maybe you're even hiding behind—you're hiding behind a filter. You're trying to hide it from everyone else. I just want you to know just let Jesus in. He really knows what's going on, just like the sinful woman who came to worship Jesus just as she was. Just as she did, bring God your whole life and trust Him with everything.

I want to ask you, "How are you?"

You go to sleep tonight. You don't wake up here on Earth.

Where are you going to wake up? See, I know there is a God because I've seen miracles. I know there is a God because I've seen demons. I know there is a God because He has restored my soul. I know God is real because I talk to Jesus every day. The Holy Spirit is the one of the Trinity God the Father, Son, Holy Spirit, who is my current help in need—His presence that comforts me that when I read the Bible, He gives me faith.

When was the last time you read your Bible? When was the last time you asked God for faith? You know, you might be saying, "Well, I'm a Christian," but you don't even know what a relationship is with God. Maybe you go to church, maybe twice a year and that's it. Do you know what a relationship is with Jesus? It's more than just praying for food and praying for the poor and doing good and doing well. It's about knowing Him.

I know God. And I have peace. And if I died tonight, and I know where I'm waking up. My dad's waiting for me on the other side; my mum's miscarried babies waiting on the other side.

I tell you right now, I love you. And I want to see you in heaven. And if you know that there's something missing in your life, my friend, I'm going to tell you right now is Jesus Christ. And I'd love to pray for you. Let me pray for you right now.

"Lord Jesus, I thank you so much for our friends, who are watching all around the world, who, Lord God, know of you, or have a religion of Christianity or Catholicism or Orthodox. Whatever it is, Lord Jesus, whether God is Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob but Lord, it's more than just knowing that God, God Almighty, the Most High God. It's about knowing Jesus as our Lord and Savior. It's about having our friendship and relationship with the Holy Spirit. Father, we thank you for the Bible. We thank you for your Word. We thank you that Your Word never comes back void. We thank You, Lord, that You never change. You're the same yesterday, today and forever. And Lord, you do have an awesome plan for everyone. We thank You, Lord, that you can do beautiful things with broken pieces when we give You our broken pieces in Your hands. And Father, when we don't even get a miracle, we can still be a miracle in your hands. Father, we thank You for heaven. We thank You for Your guidance. We thank You for Your plan, and purposes for our lives. God, I pray right now for my friends who don't know You. They know there's something missing. And some of my friends, God, you know, I'm Christian, because they know some of the Christians, and some churches have hurt them.

And Lord God, some things in our lives have maybe become so terrible and tragic, that it's impossible to believe that You're still a good God and You're watching and You're listening and You care. Lord God, wherever we're at—maybe we're thinking that we are flooded with shame and guilt and condemnation, because of our pornographic addiction or this or that or something

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that we've done or silently suffering with PTSD from an abortion or a decision that we made that we fully regret.

Lord God, we don't know what that immoral woman did to be called "the immoral woman," but Lord, we are all immoral. Compared to who You are, we have all fallen short of the glory of God. And Jesus, we thank You that knowing that You filled in the gap, for the price of sin was death, and You had no sin and You died on the cross for our sins. So, Father, if we believe that Your Son died for us, we do not die for our own sin, thus we are saved.

We thank You, Lord, right now that You would reach each individual watching this, whether it's livestream right now or pre or recorded later, the recording is being watched. Holy Spirit, You know exactly who's watching, what we need, what we're crying for, and what we're crying for silently or over. Lord Jesus, heal our heart. Take our depression, our anxiety, and our fear.

Lord, if there be anyone who feels like they've come to the end of their own path and feeling like maybe they should give up—bouts of suicide—in Jesus' name, be fully set free from that. Lord Jesus, we thank You for healing. We thank You for physical healing, but Lord, we thank You for the greatest healing of all, which is the restoring of our soul."

My friend, right now, if you haven't let Jesus into your heart, and you have not asked God to take over your life and fill you with His Holy Spirit, and lead you and guide you in a way that every decision you make is filtered through His perfect filter. And even though you may falter and fail, He will never leave you nor forsake you. If you've never started the journey of faith with Jesus Christ, would you repeat this prayer after me right now?

Say, "Lord Jesus, I come to you today, and I thank You for loving me. Thank you, God, for sending Your Son to die on the cross for my sins. I am a sinner, and I don't want to live this way. Lord, I know I can never earn heaven. I can never earn faith. So, God, give me faith, right now, as I ask You to be my Lord and Savior. Forgive me, Lord, for everything I've done wrong. Change me. I want to live for You. I want to know You. Fill me with Your Holy Spirit. I want to know Your peace, Your joy. I don't want my strength. I want Yours. I don't want my plan. I want yours. Holy Spirit, comfort me, guide me. Teach me how to pray. Show me the promises in Your Word. And when I falter, and when I fail, thank You, God, You will never leave me. I want to know your plans. And I want to know You more and more every day. In Your name, Jesus Christ, I pray. Amen."

I want to tell you that if you've said that prayer, many angels in heaven are rejoicing, and we want to help you in your yes to a relationship with Jesus Christ. And you know, when you are living a faith-filled and unfiltered life in saying yes to Him, there's going to be ups and downs. You're still going to go through ups and downs, just like I've gone through ups and downs. And I'll always go through ups and downs.

And I just want you to know that if you did say that pray with me, I want to know if you're the person that said yes to Jesus by texting me right now and my team, the number. Get your phone out. [Question #1 in the Chat]

"Sometimes I think God isn't listening to me, but I know He is. How do we really hear Him or how do we know that He's really listening?"

First of all, I just want you to know Mel C., there are many, many, many times where you look at the Bible in the faithful men and women who did exactly what God wanted them to do. How and when and exactly to the point, and I mean, Joseph ended up in prison, right? And many other people got ridiculed, abandoned, isolated. And what I love is that when Jesus came as God, Jesus came as the word in the flesh, God half-man, half-God, half-man, but fully God in flesh, okay? That's what the Bible says. And in that He took on the human form so He can know and empathize and sympathize and tell us and show us that He knows what it feels to be scared, okay?

He's sweat, blood out of fear. He knows pain, physical pain. He knows when people isolated Him, even knows how He felt when He felt Father, God turned His face away, and said, "Why have you forsaken me?" So, the first thing, Mel C, I want you to know is if you feel like God has turned His face when you're gone silent on you, it's not that He likes playing hide-and-seek, awaiting for you to become a little bit better before He actually starts talking to you or praying a certain way or adding this gift in your prayer language or whatever.

He's not waiting for you to give more money, not waiting for you to blah, blah, nothing. He loves you right now. And keep on seeking His will. Keep on praying. Go on your knees. Maybe go into fasting and prayer. I fast about 40 days a year, not in a row, but I alternate each month, three to seven days each month. And I add up into 40 for the year, and there's a lot of spiritual warfare that sometimes needs to be broken that way. Maybe, perhaps ask people to pray for you. Maybe it's you're praying for something, and He's not saying anything, but you don't accept His no. I mean, if God can say no to my prayer maybe, then God is not God. Then I'm just, I got God in my, you know, back pocket, I can text him download His app, and then rub the, you know, bottle in the genie comes out, and he can say yes to anything I want.

It's why I'm not totally at all aligned with many Christians who just say, "Claim it, get it, you know, be good, do good, and God's going to bless you and give money." I'm not that person. Because we know the rain falls and the righteous and the unrighteous. But let me tell you this Mel C., for as long as God will be feeling silent to you, I want you to know, that in the perfect timing, you're going to hear His voice again. I want you to know me, as an evangelist. There were times in my life where I felt God's gone silent on me.

Now, as I look back, I realized that it's where we have to grow in our faith. You see, many of us, we want the blueprint of God's plan for our life. But if He gave us the blueprint of the plan of our life, then why would we need faith if we know exactly what the next step is?

The pinnacle of your relationship with Jesus Christ, Mel C, is to have no understanding of what's ahead. But to know to hold your future, to believe that is God that God's grace is sufficient. And that is more than sufficient for you. Continue to go deeper and wider in your relationship with God. Read your Bible every day, and study the Word. Listen to sermons that encourage you and edify your spirit.

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But keep on going. He loves you. Keep on seeking Him and you will find him. Love you so much, Mel C. Thank you for your question.

[Questions #2 Chat] We've got Neil V.

"What's up? I'm already blessed. How can I bless others? In the Bible, it says that we can go visit the widows."

I don't know where you're from Neil. But in America, there are 125,000 foster kids waiting for a home and 111,000 children waiting to be adopted. I'm not asking you to be somebody who prays tonight, if you should be called into that ministry, as much as me telling you go find the closest in your community, foster family or adoptive family and see how you can help them.

I mean, the whole idea of 99 families coming around the one to empower the one that is doing a wonderful job in their conviction and calling in the foster care system is one example, or helping the ministries that help you know, relieve and rescue human sex slaves, about 40 million slaves out there, or feed one of the 2 billion who are hungry or sponsoring a kid through Compassion International, whatever that looks like for you.

Go and ask God what you can do. Our eight-year-old son actually takes us to the homeless, here in Dallas, and we go and we have partnered up with Soul Church locally here who helps a lot of chapters of homeless feeding ministries, have their fridges full to go and help with clothes and shoes and all these kinds of things and blankets. And we're just so, so blessed, that in the Bible—it's not rocket science—it's not just money, either. If you don't have money, it's also time, you know, be a listening ear.

If you're an older person, maybe become a mentor to somebody, encourage somebody, stop in the street, tell someone about Jesus. I mean, we're all evangelist and call to the Great Commission, are we not? So, let's all become a part of that Great Commission as it was ordained and commanded, not suggested, a commandment by God Himself for us. And may we be one in that! Amen?

#### [Question #3 Chat]

#### "How can I reveal God's love to others?"

Well, first of all, you got to love them. And when you realize how much God loves you, then you can have a humble way of self-love. For you to understand that the way that God loves you, there are no filters needed. And He loves you just the way that you are. That way when you understand how much God loves you unfiltered, you start looking at other people and taking off your filters off them. Or the filters that they've got because they think you think they need those filters. But when you go up and say, "Hey, you're looking good today. Hey, how can I pray for you? Hey, how are you doing? Hey, how was 2020?"

You been doing ok? Is there anything I can do for your family? How can I pray for you?" Whatever. Just being a friend to people picking up the phone, not just texting, say, "Hey, how are you doing? I'm thinking of you praying for you."

Whatever it is, maybe sharing your story. Remember that your history is His story. You haven't gone through what you've been through just because you've been through it and you're getting

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through it. You're growing through it, but not only are you going through history, you're actually seeing right in front of you in real life, your life, His story being authored and perfected in your faith in Him, and you just have no idea once you share your story, how much God will bless you and help you to plant seeds of faith in His love in their heart. And if you run out of ideas and how to love others, ask God for some ideas, and I'm sure He will give you some.

All right. Here we go.

"Your home is now in Texas. What happened to California?"

Well, I think California is still there from what I understand. I think California will survive clearly without Nick Vujicic. Look, there were 14 things that happened over 21 months that uprooted my spirit out of that state, I thought I would end up dying in, literally. Never thought I'd leave that beautiful state.

Many things I may save for the book. I mean, there's a whole book that can be written just on this. But I mean, it was more than just the mandatory vaccines that were issued in 2019 to all school students. It was more than the fires that evacuated my family out of their home while I was not there. It is more than finding, you know, a grenade in my house, and a drone spying on me and a bank can kicking me out of their system.

It was more than a lot of things that were happening that really uprooted me and felt unwelcome in my own hometown. And there's too much to explain. You don't need to know everything. But what I love was my, my wife was born and raised in Mexico; her father was Japanese. So, she's "Japsican" a Japanese Mexican, moved to Dallas area McKinney, in particular, when she was 18. It's where we fell in love. I looked at her, she looked at me, I couldn't feel my legs. And she lives out here.

And then we got married, went back to California. And I never thought I'd ever moved to Dallas. But let's just say the Lord moved us before all this COVID stuff happened. And we're thankful that we had that faith and boldness to come together and believe as big as this step really is that God's in it. We sold up and we moved in June last year, the DFW Metroplex. We'll never forget California. We have many friends in California, always will have family in California, and many roots in California. But I am praying for California, and some handful of states as well. I'm extremely concerned about and watching in many aspects, shapes and forms and politically, what things are happening. I'm never political, but I need to talk about what's moral at times.

And you'll be hearing the Nick Vujicic voice as a megaphone in God's hand about prolife in the coming months, and really getting loud unapologetically, and some political will talk about a morality of right to life. And so please pray for us as we step into those grounds as well. So, look, California is going to be just fine without me, a lot of wonderful ministries that will probably remain there. But we felt the calling, first of all, as a family that we may return in the coming years and seeing what has happened in the last 14 months, my wife and I have been absolutely convinced that for now, we don't see us reassigning back in California in the coming years. And so, the Board of Life Without Limbs thanks you for your prayers, as we have felt the leading of the Holy Spirit to unanimously move the ministry out of California to Dallas headquarters here.

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And man, the amazing added layered blessing of just being here and learning more about the Dallas Metroplex and the churches out here and the ministries and things like the Hope Center! Sooo encouraging! And we've had absolute confirmation and this was the move from the Lord, indeed. So, thank you for your love. Thank you for your prayers. Thank you for your financial support. We are so, so blessed to have you watch tonight.
