**Choir Director:** Good evening to you all, and it is great to be a part of this event again like we were back in 2014 with Nick Vujicic, And we're here just to pass on a little bit of Joy through music. And in case you didn't recognize the last song, most of it was in Spanish, and basically, it just said, "Come let us dance and praise." The next song comes from the 70s, the 1970s. Back in America in the 70s, there was a very famous group called Simon and Garfunkel. Those of you who are as old as me, then you will know that group.

But this group, you can still hear them on the radio, on the pop radio. And one of their most famous songs was a song called "Bridge Over Troubled Water." And if you look at the history of the song, it seems that Paul Simon was inspired by an old Christian hymn, through a Gospel group. One of the lines in that old Christian hymn was, "I'll be there for you, like a bridge over troubled waters." [speaking Hungarian, clapping]

And actually, you know, one of the hardest things over the years we've been going for 20 years as a choir, is to take Gospel songs in English and translate them into Hungarian. Hungarian language is very unique. I want to congratulate our translators, and this song, in particular, was M translated it, and so, right after our fourth and last song—I promise we will be off the stage soon—talks about how I was in despair, Jesus pulled me out of that hole of despair, and He turned my life around!

"Now I'm on my way with Jesus, turned my life around!"

**Nick:** Los Amo, Columbia! [Crowd cheering] Tonight, don't walk out of here the same you came in. I want you to walk out of here with a heart full of peace. It doesn't mean that circumstances will always change, but everything in me changed. I know who I am. I am a child of God.

[Numbers scrolling with students and people worldwide greeting Nick Vujcic]

[Crowd in arena cheering as Nick comes on stage]

**Nick:** Hello, Hungary! How are you? It is my pleasure and privilege to be with you tonight. I want to thank Victor for having me here. This is now my fourth time to Hungary. And to the lighting people, I want to see the audience just a little bit. And to the audio people, I want to turn him down just a tiny bit because we are going to get louder up here. Wonderful!

It is wonderful to be here, and Hungary, I am 40 years old, a husband, a father of 4, and when God says to go to a country, I will go to a country. And I feel that Hungary has a very special place in God's heart because the last four years, Hungary has shown Europe that Hungary has a special place in your heart with God. I want to thank you, Hungary, for your faith, your courage, your boldness, and your generosity opening up your borders, helping all the refugees from Ukraine.

I love you, Hungary, and I already know, is that I'm coming back, God willing, in September. September. I love you. God willing, tomorrow I'll be with Prime Minister Orban, is, and we'll have the privilege to meet with President Catalin, and so I want you to know that I love your country, and I've told other countries, that I'm probably not coming back. I'm semi-retiring from the road, but I really believe, maybe not every time I come back to Hungary, I'll have an event, but I believe I'll be coming at least once a year for the next 10 years.

I want to inspire your youth. I want to encourage your church, and I want you to know that I love you and stand with you, Hungary. I would like us to open up tonight with a prayer. Can we stand up and pray? First of all, are you thankful you are here tonight? [Applause] Can we thank the choir?

Can we thank them? [Applause] Thank you.

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Let's pray and thank God. Dear God we come before You, and we thank You that You are in our midst. And, Lord, only You know what we are all feeling and thinking. Some of us have a depression. Some of us have anxiety. Some of us have addictions. And some of us have different types of brokenness, and we pray tonight that, first and foremost, You would help us to know that You love us, that You are with us, that You can heal us, and give us the joy that we are looking for. And God, some of us cannot remember the last time we really laughed, but tonight, we pray for peace and joy to come back.

Bless tonight. Heal our hearts, and if there is anyone who does not know You, may they get to know You tonight. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen. You may be seated. Thank you.

I know only a little bit of Hungarian, itsy bitsy. How do you say, "I love you"? Thank you. I want to show you real quick two photos, me and my wife, and then my children. I'm sorry I haven't brought them yet to Hungary, but this is my wife. She is amazing. She's beautiful. She loves me. And these are our children.

That is an older photo for their privacy and protection. We are not going to be giving other photos. Our oldest one is now 10. Our second son is Dejon, and he is seven years old, and the twin girls are five years old. We have four biological children, and me and my wife, we know that there are half a million children in America who do not have a mom or a dad, America, and so this year, we are starting paperwork to start an adoption process, so please pray for us. Thank you. You know, my wife and I, we met in 2010. You can take the photo down, no problem. We met and it was love at first sight.

I looked at her. She looked at me. I could not feel my legs. She is half Japanese, half Mexican. We call that "Japsican." My parents were from Serbia. I was born in Australia, and I have been in America now for 20 years. I am a citizen. And I tell you right now, it's amazing to have traveled around the world: 78 countries, 3,500 speeches, 2,500 plane rides. You know, when you are on planes for so long, you cannot feel your legs. I tell you, I have had a lot of fun tricking people, too.

I am a very, very happy man because number one, I have my faith, and I will talk about that later. Number two, I love my wife. Every month, I asked her, "What am I doing that you want me to stop doing?" "What am I not doing that you want me to start doing?" and "What am I doing well that you want me to keep on doing?" Do you know what happens in a marriage when you actually have such a conversation? It is amazing. My wife is my best friend. And then, in order, after my wife, I love my children. I love my kids so much.

They are not just my children; they are my best friends. And I will never forget my oldest son. He was sitting on the kitchen floor with me, and he said, "Daddy, I wish you had arms." I said, "Why?" He said, "Because then I could know how it feels to be hugged by you." And I am like, "Aww." And then he said, "But it is okay." I said, "Why?" He said, "I am strong, and I am just going to hug you longer and stronger so you can feel my hug more. I am the shortest one in the home again, but they all look up to me. They love me.

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That is why I am rich, not because of where I live, not because of the ethnicity of where I am from, not because of money. I will tell you right now, money comes and goes, and many things in our life we think that are impossible are possible. I thought it was impossible to dream of a wife like her. Well, my dream came true. I used to be worried that I cannot hold her hand. I do not hold her hand; I hold her heart. You do not need arms and legs. You do not need to move countries.

You need the real things in life. First thing, faith. Second thing, family. And when you realize these are the greatest things in your life--there is nothing wrong with money, as long as you do not worship money as your God, as your security. And I want you to know, I'm not someone to tell you that I understand your pain.

But I am going to tell you right now, that sometimes, dreams come true. Sure, I also had a dream that I would have arms and legs. With my faith, I believe that God can do all things. So, do I have a pair of shoes in my closet? Yes, of course. Of course, I do. [Applause]

I have seen miracles. God does not always heal physical bodies. And that was my question. When I was a kid, when I did not know my purpose, when I did not think I would make money, when I did not think I would get married, I was asking God--maybe the same question you've asked Him about your life. "Where are You if You are real?" And He did not answer me. And my mom and dad, they said, "Do not worry. God has got a plan for you. You are beautiful. It is going to be okay." But I went to school, and I saw everyone had more than me. So, I asked, "Why? Why was I born this way?" And my parents did not know.

The doctors did not know. In fact, they did not know that I was going to be born this way. And when they all saw me, the doctors told my parents, "We are so sorry. He will never have a good life. He will never walk." [Nick walks across the table.] [Applause] "He will never go to school."

In 1989, when I was six years old, my mom went to the government and said, "Why cannot my son go to a normal school?" And you know what they did? They changed the law. My mom is a hero. How much courage is that? [Applause]

It was amazing. My parents were not rich. My parents were refugees. They fled Serbia. They fled Yugoslavia. My mom was six years old. My dad was 15 years old, and they said, "We don't know why God allowed you to be born this way.

"Do not focus on what you cannot change. Focus on what you can change. You have no limbs, but you have a brain. Use your brain. Do not focus on what you do not understand about God. Focus on what you do understand about God."

So I prayed to God, and I said, "Can you please change my life? Can You give me arms and legs? If I had arms and legs, everything would be different." Now I want to tell you that I am sorry for any pain that you have gone through. I am sorry if someone has abused you verbally,

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emotionally, sexually. I am sorry. I am sorry if you live in a broken home. I tell teenagers all around the world that I believe it is worse being in a broken home than having no limbs. I am not going by suffering to yours.

And again, I will never say that I understand your pain, but there is someone who does, and His name is Jesus. And when I heard that, I wanted to know then, "Why is He ok then for me to feel so bad?"

And so I hated God...for 5 years. Do you want to know one of the reasons why I did not want to become a Christian? Because of Christians. Christians who said they were Christians. But they are sexually active, and they swear before they get even married, and they say they are Christian.

There were many reasons why I was not a Christian. I had my excuses. But my excuses, when I look at human beings, that is a human being. They are a broken human being. That does not change who God is. But still the question: God must make sense. I do not want to be a Christian just because someone told me. I do not want to say, "Well, my culture is Christian so I am Christian."

There are other people in the world who have a religion, and they say they have the religion because of their parents, because of their ethnicity. But then, they look into the Holy Scripture, and they say, "Oh! No, no, no, but I don't believe that part." I've heard people of other religions saying, "I'm that religion, but I don't believe that part in Scripture."

And I tell them, "Then why am I different from you? I can choose a little bit of this, choose a little bit of that. That is not truth." But I want to believe that in one Scripture, in total—maybe I cannot understand all the Bible, but what I understand is that God is the God of love.

And even though I was at age 10, hated Him, and even tried to commit suicide in my bathtub, I tried to drown myself. I was swallowing in water before I was going to start inhaling it. And while I was rolling over, I was stopped by one thought, and it was in my mind, a picture of my parents crying at my grave. And all my parents did for me was love me.

"You're beautiful! We love you. You are beautiful. We love you!" So I decided to stay because I did not want to leave them with their pain. I was still depressed. But then, at age 13, I was playing soccer. I love soccer. I love footsie—football, right? And so I love football, and I am playing on the field, and my friend is way back, and he is getting ready to kick it to me, and I am little scared. I am small. The ball is big, and he has got a big kick. So my palms were sweaty.

My knees were shaking, and he said, "Are you ready?" I said, "Yes!"

[Looking at translator] Good job!...Hey, can we thank Bob? Bob, you are awesome, man. [Bob hugs Nick.]

You're doing a great job, thank you." [Applause]

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And he kicks the ball to me. [Nick motions the kick with his little foot.] [Bob, the translator, shows how to kick the ball with his own foot, and audience laughs.]

And then the ball is coming for me, and I jump up in the air, and I kick the ball, and the ball sprained my foot. I could not walk for three weeks. I was in bed, and you know what I said? "Thank you, God, for my little foot." It is so true. My parents told me, "Be thankful for what you have." The person sitting next to you, Bob, next to me...me next to Bob. There is not another Bob. There will never be another Bob.

He believes in Jesus. He believes in Heaven, and when he dies, there is only one cure of death, which is resurrection. That's why we believe in Jesus. He knows he is not dying. He knows he is not reincarnating.

He is just never going to die. And he knows that as a person, it does not matter how he looks, what he does, he is the only Bob in the world. I am the only Nick in the world. Take out my tongue, chop it, chop off my ears, burn my skin. You will never touch my soul.

There is not another you, and you are not defined by how you look, or what you have, or what you do or what you can or cannot do, or how many friends you have on Facebook or TikTok. I love you just the way that you are, and you are alive, and when you are alive, you are breathing, and when you are breathing, you are going to survive today, and yesterday is history.

When it is tomorrow, today is history. My history is HIS STORY.

And I know that every day my story is evolving. For as long as I am breathing, my story is not done yet. This is not how it ends! If you've been abused, and you have not been healed, this is not where it ends. God can heal you. God can redeem you. I want you to know I still go through depression.

Recently, I could not talk to anybody.

I could not talk to my wife for 30 days. I went to counseling. I had a lot going on in my life. I found a grenade at my home. I got kicked out of a bank in 2019. I had a lawsuit against me, and they did not win. I was found not guilty.

When you get a lawsuit and a grenade, and you get kicked out of a bank, that is a bad year. And that is stress. It was hard. And my wife said, "Maybe you should talk to somebody." So, I got counseling. And it was beautiful. The counselor, he says, "Tell me what you want to talk about." It was not about 2019. It was about 2002, 2006, 2007, 2008, 2011, 2013.

Nine people betrayed me, and I never healed. And he said, "And so, what happened?" And I told him what happened.

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He said, "How did you make...he said, seriously, that is what happened?"

He starts crying. It made me feel good. When your counselor cries, you know it is bad. He said, "So how did it make you feel?" And I told him how it made me feel.

And he said, " Is there anything else that you want to say?"

I said, "No, not about that, but I want to tell you about something else now."

And do you know what was amazing? I realized my wounds were healed when I talked it through.

Sometimes praying, depression can go. Sometimes you need counseling, and I want you to know, God loves you. He will never give up on you. He has a plan for you. When you come to Him, He can heal your wounds. Alcohol cannot heal your wounds. Pornography cannot heal your wounds. Having an affair outside of marriage cannot heal your wounds.

Having all the money in the world cannot heal your wounds.

And if you are single, and you hope to get married to be happy, go talk to the married people. If you are not happy single with Jesus, then you are not going to be happy married. Talk to the married people. Marriage is hard work. So, I want to ask you, do you have wounds?

Do you have disabilities? What do you go to?

"Oh, one day, I am 13 years old, 14 years old. I just need to get older and find my independence."

"I need to graduate high school, get a university degree, and then things are going to get better."

They get to the university, and now they are stressed. "Oh, if I can find a job, or if I can just find a job, then everything is going to be ok."

They finally get a job, and after two days they hate their boss. Do you understand?

Or, "If I could just make a little bit more money...."

You get the money, and you want a little bit more. You got a house, You want a bigger house.

You want a car? One day, you want to get a better car. Our human nature is like this. But when you actually come to Jesus, all these things don't matter, and it doesn't satisfy you. And for me in my life, I could be a good person, but I knew it is not enough.

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I knew there was a spiritual realm, and I looked at different religions. In some religion, I am an outcast. I am disabled. I am not even human to some religions. Another religion—pray 5 times a day, be good, do good, read their holy scripture, memorize it, and then maybe, you get to heaven. I do not want a "maybe." Oh, in their same holy scripture, it says in that religion, there is one way to be guaranteed to Heaven--if you kill a Christian. Well, I know that I do not want to be that religion.

That does not make sense.

There are other religions that say, "Be good. Do good, and good is going to happen." I cannot believe that because I am good. I thought I was good. I am a pretty good guy, but still bad things happening. So, what is it? What is that truth? Is there a one truth?

When I was 13, someone said, "Oh, were you born this way?"

I said, "Yes."

She said, "Would you like to know why?"

She said, "Reincarnation."

I said, "What's that?"

She said, "In your previous life... Previous life?" Nick questioned.

She said, "Yeah, previous life, you were a bad boy, and now you are being punished."

I am like, "What? How did she, like, seriously, how did she find me, you know, in a previous life. I do not even have fingerprints. She cannot track me down."

She said, "Do not worry. In your next life, now that you are a good boy, you are going to come back like a butterfly."

"I don't want to be a butterfly. I don't want to be a *pillangó*. You know how many butterflies I have killed in my wheelchair? That sucks.

I want you to know the beauty of today. You are human, and you have exactly what Adam and Eve had, free will. You can choose, and you will choose. If you don't choose a religion, that is a choice. Indecision is your decision.

And as I studied the Bible, I read John, Chapter 9. A man was born with a disability, and people ask Jesus why. Let me tell you first, where did disabilities come from? Adam and Eve were in the Garden of Eden with God. It was perfect, no death, no sickness, no disease, disability, nothing bad. It was perfect. Satan came into the Garden of Eden. God allowed Satan to come into the Garden of Eden to prove to you and me that he gave Adam and Eve free will.



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Satan said something different than God, and they chose to believe what Satan said. They sinned. They were evicted from the Garden of Eden, because in front of God, our righteousness is nothing more than feces. If I lie once, I am a liar. If I have stolen, I am a thief.

If I am jealous of you, that is a sin. If I hate somebody--have you ever hated somebody? Oh, you did not tell them anything. Compared to God, His righteousness, if I hate you.... Maybe I do not go to jail because I hate Bob here in Hungary, if I hate him as long as I do not hurt him, that's the law of Hungary. If I am a criminal, I go to jail. God's law--I cannot even hate you.

I need to forgive my enemies. That is how righteous He is. And if I hate him, I have killed him in my own heart. God is so holy, and Adam and Eve, they then were cursed with death, sickness, disease, and we now see human race. I want you to know that death came from sin. Jesus had no sin.

He died for us. He was fully man and fully God. He was the only One who said that He was God.

He did not say, "I know the way to Heaven." He said, "I am the Way to Heaven. I am the Resurrection and the Life."

When His body was buried, you know where Jesus' Spirit was? He went to hell, and He had a speech to all the demons and Satan himself. This is in the Bible.

He took the keys of hell, and now, my King of kings, conquered sin and conquered death. My physical body will die, but my spirit goes on. I am not a human. I am an eternal spirit in a temporary body. I want you to know that this is more than a story or a book. You want to know why I believe in God? Not because I've seen angels, but I've seen demons walking through my hotel room. Satanism is real. Witchcraft is real. Black magic and curses are real. Demons are real. I have seen them. And I have seen also miracles of God.

So the Bible says, we are cursed with disabilities and death, not because God gave me this disability. This is not the perfect body. My perfect body is up there. He has got a body. He is pretty good looking, but He's got a body up there. This is temporary, and we know that I am going to die one day, physically.

Maybe I die of cancer. Maybe I die of a car crash. Maybe I die of old age. Maybe someone shoots me. It does not matter. I do not care. Christians die. Do you want to know why? Because we are not supposed to stay here. There is a purpose for your existence here: To know Him, to love Him, to choose Him, and He heals your heart.

And He frees you. And now I realize, without arms and legs, I can now be the hands and feet of God to go and reach out to someone else who does not know Him. We will pray for cancer to be gone, in Jesus' name, now--every sickness, every disease, every disability, in Jesus' name, be healed. But we also know that God does the greatest miracle of all. He rescues your soul.

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I do not know if He is going to give me arms and legs, but I am not waiting for a circumstance to change. I am not waiting for that miracle. When you do not get a miracle, Hungary, be one.

If God can use a man without arms and legs to be His hands and feet, then God can use any willing heart.

So disabilities came from the enemy. Depression came from the enemy, but it came from the enemy, but the Bible says,

"What the enemy tried to use for bad, God can turn it into good."

If you trust Him. If you seek Him, you will find Him.

Can I ask for some keyboardist, Chris, up here, please? I'll play piano, but I'm not warmed up yet.

Take a deep breath in and out. At age 15, I saw those people in the Bible asking Jesus, "Why was this man born blind?"

Jesus didn't say, "I don't know."

He said, "Yes, it was done so that the works of God will be shown."

And Jesus spits in the dirt, and he gets that dirt and he puts it on the blind man's face. Then the blind man sees. And you know what touched me the most? It wasn't another miracle. I have read about miracles, but what touched me was the blind man.

Can you imagine if I am blind and you hear a [spit], and someone approaches me, and puts mud on my face?

"What? Who are you?" Keep right there. Keep right there.

"What do you want me to...? Tell me your plan, and then I'll tell you if I trust you."

Does that sound similar? "God, tell me your plan! Then, I'll tell you if I trust you. Show me a miracle. Where are you?"

He's here.

He's here. And even if you hate Him, He still loves you.

And at age 15, I realized that if God told me His plan when I was young—"Nick, do not worry. I am going to use you around the world. You are going to meet Presidents, speak in stadiums,

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and by age 40, 2.8 billion people will know your story, and 750 million people will have heard the Gospel of Jesus Christ by age 40. And governments will ask you for advice, and you will speak to all the world.

What if God told me that? If I knew all of that, at age 8, first of all, I would die of shock! It's impossible! Impossible!

Second, if I knew what was going to happen, then when can I exercise faith? When you have faith, you believe in God before you see Him. I believe in Him. I have not seen Him. And He actually rejoices in me more than angels because I believe, yet not seeing!

He loves me. He loves me. He loves you, not because of what you do--because you are His! I am not a kid with no limbs. I am not a child without limbs. I am a child of God. I am the ambassador for the King of Kings and Lord of Lords. And I will do everything I can to let one more person know that Jesus loves you, too.

He loves you now.

And you may not know His plan, but He will give you faith. This table--if this is the path towards truth--You know those lies in your head. "Oh, you are not good enough! Just give up! You need to become better before...someone who says they are a Christian. You will never be happy! Just give up! Just give up!"

I love this non-profit organization "Never Give Up." It is such an important, important message. These lies are not from God. These lies are from the enemy, and to the enemy....

[Nick sticks out his tongue, making a sound.]

You know why he gave me a foot? So when I turn my back on the enemy, I also crush his head. The Bible says, "His head is crushed by the heels."

You turn around, you say, "No, I know the truth, and the truth will set me free."

I know I am broken, but He came for the broken. I know I am addicted, but He came for the addicted. I know I am unrighteous, but he came for the unrighteousness. He came for the sick. He came for the dying. He came for the sinner. He came for me, and He is here for you, and I want you to know that tonight you have a choice. You have a choice. Will you believe?

Is it because of Christians or a church that you don't want to become a Christian? I encourage you to go to a church, but you can find Jesus outside of a church. We go to church as a family of God. We are adopted into the family of God. We are here for each other, to pray for one another, to help each other. That is what families should be, but do not make the church the excuse.

That does not change the Gospel. You need Him, and you need Him tonight.

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When your house is broken and he knocks on your door, let Him in. Do not say, "Wait, wait, wait. I have got to clean up the house. I have got to clean my tongue. I need to stop swearing. I need to stop this. I need to stop that. Not yet, Jesus. Not yet!"

No! He came for you, to heal your heart, to renew your mind. He has a hope, plan, and future for you. And you do not have to do this on your own anymore. You cannot shake off your addiction. You cannot get rid of your own shame and guilt. You cannot work your way up to being a good person to hopefully get into heaven. It is when you say, "Jesus, I believe in You."

"I do not want my plan. I do not want my strength. I want Your plan. I want your strength. Will you please come into my life?"

"I believe You died for me. I believe You rose again, and I believe that You have the power. If you have a plan for Nick, and he still has ups and downs, then you have a plan for me.

Today. will you receive it? Receive what? The truth. Will you make a decision? Tomorrow is not promised. Anybody promised tomorrow? No. So, now is now. Do not delay. Make your decision today.

And right now, if we can raise a little bit of the lights, just a little bit. Do you know "Amazing Grace"? Thank you. If we can do "Amazing Grace," that would be great. Listen, right here, right now, Do you know the song "Amazing Grace"? Can you play that, please? Thank you so much.

Right now, I'm going to give you an opportunity to stand in your seat if you do not have a relationship with Jesus Christ. I am not talking to the people who are believers. I am talking to the people right now who do not know if they are going to heaven.

You do not have a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. In a moment, I am going to get you to stand. Why? Yeah, you could say this prayer in your chair.

Again, God would hear your prayer, but if you cannot stand up for a faith decision right here in this place, you will not be able to stand up for your faith out there. And with all of heaven right now watching and witnessing, right now—tonight—will you confess your sins and say,

"God I am a sinner. I do not deserve Heaven. I will never be perfect, but You are going to be with me. I want You in my life. Forgive me. Help me to turn away from the lies. I know right now that I am caught in a lifestyle of sin. But I do not want to sin anymore. I want You."

(Can you go slower, much slower, please. Thank you.)

Right now, I want you to stand. If you know that you need to make your life right with Jesus Christ, I want to pray with you. I am going to pray for you, and then I am going to say a prayer

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that you can follow me in. So, right now, I see people standing. If you know that you need to make your life right with Jesus, right now, stand to your feet.

Come on, let's clap and encourage them! [Applause.]

Can we turn up the lights? Can you turn up the lights? Wave to me if you're standing. I want to see you. Wow! Amazing! Remain standing. I believe there are more people. You know you need Jesus in your life. He is more than a ritual and a tradition, more than going to church twice a year. It is having a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. So right now, I am going to give you a final call.

If you have not stood up yet, and you want to, stand now. This is the final call. Stand. Stand. Stand. Stand. Stand.

[Applause.] Now give me a wave if you are standing. Amazing! Amazing!

Let me pray. LORD, God, we thank You so much for today. We thank You, that You are a God of love, a God of kindness, a God of healing. Lord Jesus, heal us. Thank you for the cross. Thank You for Your power, and thank You for Your kindness. God, I am a sinner. Right now, repeat after me,

"Dear God, I am a sinner. I am sorry for my sin. I want to know You. Please heal my heart. Fill me with Your Holy Spirit. I want Your peace and Your strength. I turn away from sin. I know I will never be perfect, but today I choose to live for You and with You. Teach me how to pray and speak to me as I read the Bible. Heal my mind, and give me joy. When I cannot feel joy, help me know Your comfort. In the name of Jesus, I pray. Amen."

Amen. Amen.

Let's give God a round of worship and clapping. [Applause.]

If you are standing, pause. This is the beginning. You might think tomorrow,

"What do I do now?"

Volunteers, right now, are going to give you something in your hand. There is the Gospel of John they are going to give you. It is a book of the Bible. It is the Gospel according to the writer John, Apostle John. And as you read the Bible, God will give you faith. How do I know that? Because the Bible says that, and when you read the Bible, it gives you faith. And you are going to need faith every day. Pray as you can.

Someone brought you here from a church? Go back to that church. Find a Bible-believing church that reads the Bible.
